Mr Harrow, who lives in Darlington with his wife, Sarah-Louise, and young son Jacob, adds: "We would invite recruitment professionals of all levels to contact us to discuss the many opportunities we currently have.

an apprentice, Laurel Barr. She was straight out of school and turned up to her interview wearing big loopy ear-rings, hair extensions and Ugg

"But as a result of the right exposure and her own drive, she has become one of my most trusted employees over the last few years. Now she sits in front of directors and operations managers on an almost daily basis. She's just flown.

"In my opinion, many smaller companies use apprentices as a mechanism to get cheap employees but that's not what it should be about.

"We're going to have three apprentices through Darlington College and it'll always be through Darlington College because I think it's important that we engage with the local college; one in accounts, one in recruitment operations and one in marketing.

"There are many reasons but, for

a business that is doing well from a growth and economic point of view, to give something back to the local economy that's facilitating and supporting that growth is very important to me.

"We're taking three people fresh out of education or out of unemployment and giving them an opportunity. I came through that route and so did some of my other best-performing staff.

"And we're looking for that next superstar, somebody who can one day become the next manager of this branch or directors of this division. It sounds corny but the apprentices that we bring in will be the future of the

"But we're also looking for motivated, proven professionals with a track record in recruitment to join our

While their work with Aldi in particular has seen Baxter Personnel set up a branch in South Yorkshire, the company will always focus on the North-East and their proposed new state-of-theart offices in Darlington further serve to demonstrate that.

Mr Harrow adds: "The fact that we enjoy great relationships with such a broad spectrum of clients is, I believe, reflective of our high standards. We offer the best service and we have the most driven and most passionate people around.

"Did I think we'd be where we are so quickly? No. I didn't think within four years of me taking control that the business would be employing 30 people and being awarded the contracts that we have been, but that's testament to the staff.

"Without the team here, we wouldn't be where we are and hopefully our new staff can play an equally big part."





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
